Cultural Program

As the largest binational center in Peru and Latin America, ICPNA offers a wide variety of cultural activities that take place in our auditoriums and galleries. At these cultural events you will learn about Peruvian culture, especially its customs and traditions. They include Peruvian dance recitals, plays, art exhibitions and concerts.

Self-Access Center (SAC)

All students can access the multimedia laboratory for interactive practice that offers the opportunity to reinforce what was learned in class.

Library

At all ICPNA branches, there are libraries that provide materials written in both English and Spanish. Through its wide collection of books, magazines, dictionaries, encyclopedias, videos, DVDs, CDs, and children's stories, ICPNA seeks to promote the art of reading as well as academic research. An automated catalog system allows information searches from more than 200,000 publications.

- Library materials check-out.
- Free Internet service for 12 non-cumulative monthly sessions of 30 minutes each.
- Video room access, according to the weekly program schedule.
- Online database service, where there is a wide selection of articles and publications, such as magazines, journals, gazettes, and newspapers.

Program
for foreigners**



The Spanish Program at ICPNA provides a balanced focus on listening, speaking, reading and writing skills throughout all its levels. Classes are tailored to meet the needs of specific individuals, groups and classes.



The program is offered to tourists, business people, executives, students, and anyone else who wishes to communicate in Spanish.

Classes are offered on weekdays, Saturdays and Sundays in a variety of schedules. Applicants with previous knowledge of Spanish may request a placement examination to determine the appropriate course level to study in the program. These examinations can be taken from Monday to Friday at the ICPNA Miraflores branch.

METHODOLOGY

Today's classrooms are comprised of students who have different learning styles and special needs, and who represent different cultural backgrounds. Consequently, the program promotes student-centered learning that attends to such diversity and encourages students to become involved in their own learning.

Students are taken on guided tours by their teachers, using Spanish to interact in real-life situations and reinforcing what was learned in class. They can also access a variety of online resources any time they wish to practice on their own.

LEVELS

LEVELS	MONTHS	AIMS
Basic	6	Students will be able to communicate in everyday situations on an elementary level, using topics related to basic personal information (such as family, work, school, etc.).
Intermediate	6	Students will be able to communicate with ease in situations and contexts that go beyond daily activities, using grammatical structures of greater complexity and a broader vocabulary.
Advanced	6	Students will acquire a level of proficiency that will let them speak and write about various abstract topics. They will be able to understand literary texts and participate in discussions on complex topics.

REGISTRATION

To register, students should go to the Information Desk with a valid ID (passport, resident alien card, etc.). Payments can be made in cash, by credit card (Visa or MasterCard) or through any of the BCP's banking channels: branches or online banking (www.viabcp.com, if you have an account affiliated to this service). Online registration is available as of the second cycle.

CERTIFICATE

Upon completing each phase, students receive a **certificate**. At the end of the entire program, they can participate in a **graduation ceremony** along with students from the English language program.
