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



What is Reading?

Reading is defined as a cognitive process that involves decoding symbols to arrive at meaning. Reading is an active process of constructing meanings of words. Reading with a purpose helps the reader to direct information towards a goal and focuses their attention.

Why is it important for our students to read?

Because reading texts provide good model for English writing. When we teach the skill of writing, we will need to show students models of what we are encouraging them to do.

Implement a space in your classroom for this purpose, if you lack space you can put posters and decorate it with your students. Creating the atmosphere will influence positively and hook students into Reading.








Celebrate your students 'achievement


Start a collection of book spines as they will be a way of recording the number of books read during the school year, it will go along your "Plan Lector".








GRAPHIC ORGANIZERS

What is Writing



Why is it important for our students to write?






the content of this visual tool.




WASAP TEXTS

Grammar used, number of words, content related conversations.


When it comes to check the texts written praise and also provide feedback. Wasap is communication through writing!!






WRITING PORTFOLIOS


- •Reading and writing can be described as parallel processes.


